

Forecast of Rain Keeps Members from Tucson Classics Car Show

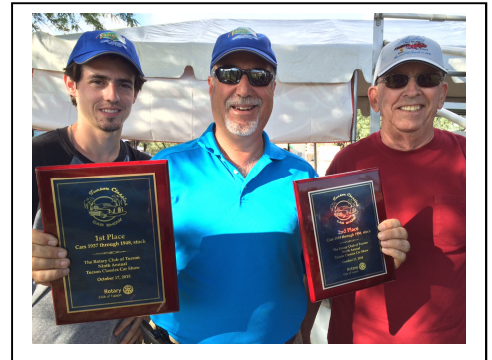
